## "What Does the <u>God</u> of this <u>World</u> Say about the god of this <u>world</u>: the god of Sex?"

"Many people assume the Bible has just one message about sex: Don't do it."
-Peggy Fletcher Stack, "What They Didn't Teach You About Sex in Sunday School"

- 1) Sex was God's idea not ours! (Gen. 1:28)
- 2) God made us as sexual creatures. (Gen 1:26,27)
  - Gender identity is part of God's created order.
  - Sin has <u>short-circuited</u> gender identity both <u>genetically</u> and <u>socially</u>. All humans struggle in different ways and with different intensity to be what God created them to be.
- 3) Sex is God's good gift to be enjoyed between a man and a woman within the covenant of marriage between a man and a woman (Gen. 2:24-25). Thus premarital sex, extramarital sex, and unnatural sex is sinful and wrong.
- 4) Sex within marriage is for the purposes of:
  - a) <u>Procreation</u> (Gen. 1:28; 4:1)
  - b) Partnership (Gen. 2:24; 24:67)
  - c) Pleasure (Prov. 5:15-19; Song of Solomon [the whole book!])
  - d) Protection (Prov. 5:20; I Cor. 6:18; 7:2-5)
  - e) Portrait (Eph. 5:22-33)
- 5) Remember that men are moved by what they <u>see</u> and ladies are moved by what they feel (Song of Solomon 4:1-5:1).
  - Men must flee the pitfall of pornography.
  - Women must not be seduced by the winsomeness of words.
    - o Be sensitive to what you watch and what you wear.
- 6) God calls the follower of Jesus not just to <u>abstinence</u>, but to <u>purity</u>, both in <u>thought</u> and <u>action</u> (Matt. 5:27-30).
- 7) Sex is a powerful <u>passion</u> that can override both the <u>mind</u> and <u>will</u>. It must be handled with <u>great care</u>.
  - a) Guard your thought life (Prov. 23:7; Rom. 12:2).
  - b) Guard your <u>eyes</u> (Job. 31:1; Prov. 20:12).
  - c) Watch your hands, your pelvic area and your mouth (I Cor. 6:18).
  - d) Never be alone with someone of the opposite sex. Always make sure there are people around.
  - e) Never do anything you would not be willing to do in a room full of people.
  - f) Never do what you would not want done to and with your future mate.

8) Follow God's guidelines for good decision-making and the "Gray" areas of life.

## Paul's Corinthian Principles I Corinthians 6:12-11:1

- 1. Will this action edify self? (6:12)

  Will it build me up? Profit me? Help me personally?
- 2. Will this action enslave my soul? (6:12)

  Can it bring me into emotional/psychological (even chemical) bondage?
- 3. Will this action exalt the Savior? (10:31) Can I glorify my Lord in this activity?
- 4. Will this action encourage other saints? (8:13) *Is this a potential stumbling block to someone else?*
- 5. Will this action evangelize sinners? (9:19-22; 10:32-33) Will this help or harm my witness for Christ?
- 6. Will this action be an example of my Savior? (11:1) *Is this something I could see Jesus doing?*
- 9) Remember the <u>myth</u> of "safe sex" is just that: a <u>myth</u>. No sex is safe, though married sex can be safe, fruitful, beautiful, and an <u>act of worship</u> before God.
- 10) Remember that the wrong  $\underline{\text{person}}$  + the wrong  $\underline{\text{time}}$  + the wrong  $\underline{\text{place}}$  = the wrong  $\underline{\text{thing}}$  happening.
